## **Aye-ayes and Polar Bears**

We would recommend that your child reads lots and continues to access Doodle Maths and Doodle Spell. They can also access Doodle Tables to practice their recall of multiplication facts. Children should know which table they are working on, but as a rough guide: they should know x2 x10 and x5, and be working on x3 x4 x8 and x6.
