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# Home Learning - Part One

Dear Parents,

I am writing to you to explain how to provide your child with suitable home learning if your child is isolating and is well enough to be able to complete schoolwork.

# Years 1 – Y6: What to do if my child is awaiting a test result or is self-isolating because of 'Track and Trace'.

Firstly, we would encourage your child to complete their doodle challenges for maths, English and spelling on a daily basis and obviously daily reading is extremely important. For daily lessons which best replicate an actual lesson we have chosen to direct you to the government approved **Oak National Academy** website.
