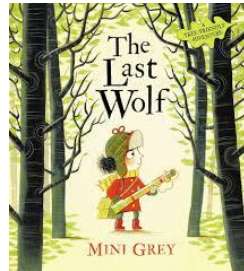
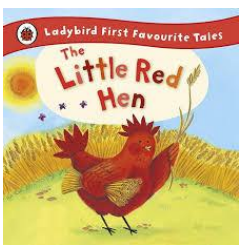

Communication and Language

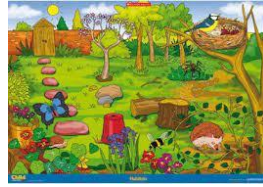
