Pupils have been asked to come dressed in 1940s style costume with an identity label, gas mask box, suitcase or pillow-case for belongings and suitable wartime lunch (we will be making identity labels and gas mask boxes at school). Here are a few ideas for costumes and what to put in your child's packed lunch.

### **Costume**

Coming in wartime dress need not be an expensive enterprise and can be achieved with just a little effort and imagination! If there are difficulties children could always wear school uniform as they would have been evacuated collectively as a school.

Ideas for boys: short trousers, shirt and sweater or sleeveless pullover. Dark knee length socks, shoes, plimsolls or even wellington boots but NOT trainers. If possible, a school cap or balaclava.

Ideas for girls: dress or skirt and blouse with a cardigan. Shoes, plimsolls and short socks. Hats could include hand knitted ones, berets, straw boaters or even balaclavas. Long hair can be tied in plaits.

Clothes that are too small look good- it is make do & mend! Take battered teddy for really good effect.

### **Wartime lunch**

Don't forget many food items were rationed during the war.

White bread sandwiches/ rolls with cheese, jam, corned beef, marmite or beetroot apples, pears, plums, tomatoes or scrubbed carrots, slice of homemade cake, rock cakes made with dried eggs, meat, chocolate, crisps, bananas and One Direction type lunch boxes are banned! (we will provide paper bags for their lunch)
